Interdisciplinary Refresher Course in Information Technology for college and university teachers inaugurated at KU

An interdisciplinary Refresher Course of two weeks duration in Information Technology was inaugurated at the University of Kashmir on Saturday for which 80 faculty members working in colleges and universities both from within and outside J&K have registered themselves. Guest of Honour, Dr. Nisar Ahmad Mir in his inaugural address stressed upon the need for enhancing the IT skills of both teaching and non-teaching staff of our higher educational institutions and applauded the efforts made by team HRDC this year in conducting their courses in the online mode. He ensured all possible help in upgrading the existing infrastructure and online teaching facilities of HRDC. Dr. Mir called upon the HRDC to conduct courses for capacity building of teachers and non-teaching staff and academic administrators as well with a view to hone and harness their administrative and managerial skills so that alongside teaching our teachers could also contribute significantly towards the body corporate and governance of their universities and colleges.
